In the framework of the EU-<u>European Institute of the Mediterranean (IEMed)</u> co-funded project <u>Support to Reflection and Consultations on the Pact for the Mediterranean</u>, and in partnership with the <u>Policy Center for the New South (PCNS)</u>, the first **EuroMeSCo Consultation Circle: Consulting Southern Partners** will take place on 13-14 May in Rabat, Morocco.

The New Pact for the Mediterranean is set to become the European Union's principal political framework for strengthening strategic cooperation with its Southern Neighbourhood partners. It aims to offer a renewed and comprehensive approach that addresses the region's complex challenges while unlocking opportunities for deeper collaboration across shared priority areas.

This consultation, held in Rabat, serves as a dedicated platform for structured dialogue with policymakers, think tankers, civil society actors, and private sector stakeholders from North Africa. Focusing on three main dimensions that are vital to the region's long-term development: fostering economic growth through trade, investment and engagement with the private sector; empowering the next generation by aligning skills with employment and mobility opportunities; and promoting sustainable transformation through decarbonised approaches to food systems, water management, and environmental resilience.

By drawing on local knowledge, successful initiatives, and the experience of key actors, this consultation contributes directly to shaping a Pact that is grounded in the realities of the Southern Neighbourhood and designed to serve the aspirations of both shores of the Mediterranean.
